Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord – March 29, 2026 -

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Today we celebrate Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord and begin another Holy Week. Processions seem to be an important part of Holy Week, especially the three day liturgy that is the Easter Triduum.

We begin our celebration this Sunday with a procession into the church with palms to walk with Christ, showing our readiness to die with Christ and that we will rise with him. Representatives from our parishes will gather with all the parishes in the diocese this Tuesday to process into St. Columba Cathedral to celebrate the Chrism Mass with Bishop Bonnar, as he blesses the holy oils that will be used in baptism, confirmation, ordination and the anointing of the sick.

Holy Thursday as we celebrate the Mass of our Lord's Supper we will process with the Blessed Sacrament out of the church walking with Christ from the Last Supper to Gethsemane to pray with him. Good Friday we process forward for the Veneration of the Cross in humble gratitude for Christ's sacrifice.

At the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday, we begin with the procession with the Easter Candle from the darkness to bring the light of Christ into the celebration. This most solemn liturgy of the whole year retells, from scripture, the important points of salvation history. We receive the Elect into the Church as they process to the Baptismal Font for baptism and then to the altar to receive the Eucharist.

Please check out the information and times of our parishes Holy Week celebrations in this bulletin. Our celebrations will be shared among our three parishes in collaboration. May you try to participate in as much of the Triduum as possible. It is a great sign of what we celebrate at every Mass and why we live as disciples of Christ. It can also be a blessing that enriches our Easter celebration.
